# Long term Recovery Updates:

# <u>Spokane County Wildfire Update</u> – Terri Cooper – Mayor – Medical Lake

Terri provided the following update:

- Currently eight homes under construction work on mechanicals should be complete by year end
- Mennonite Disaster Services will be sending volunteer in January, but more volunteer help is needed

• The plan for 2025-26 is for 10-12 additional homes to be built. Will need to raise about \$1million for these homes and volunteers will be needed.

## Member Report Outs:

### LTRG

**Terri Cooper Spokane Region LTRG** gave update on August 2023 wildfire response. Largest asset loss in Spokane county history 366 homes lost and over 700 structures. Progress is going well and more FEMA funding is coming to build housing for the remaining unhoused.

Andy & Joyce Royce, Mennonite Disaster Services gave update on their work in Spokane- and the new funding for houses will trigger more response by their organization.

**Disaster Leadership Team** still engaging in Lahaina, forming a strike team to build 15 homes for highly vulnerable and lower income folks. Looking for creative ideas on housing for volunteers on Maui.

**Jim Mahon, Churches of Scientology Disaster Response**- they are helping in LA in a big way and in SE> here is a link to newsletter folks can see morel: <u>https://www.volunteerministers.org/news/</u>

**Ray Shjerven, Lutheran Disaster Services**- Going door to door in NC to combat misinformation. Fed Govt. DOGE is also attacking LDS in an awful way. Most of what you see on social about LDS and disaster misinformation is false and we need to educate our constituents.

**Jill Watson, Seattle Human Services ESF 6 lead City** held meetings to support immigrants and refugees and is monitoring funding of programs that impact city.

- Talked about Bomb Cyclone some too- Seattle City Light had 20% of customers lose powerworst since 2006 Hanukkah Eve Storm
- Talked about 2026 workdcup-6 games with fan sites across the state. ESF6 developing reunification plan, just in case
